

Monthly Report Form: August 2023: ARPA Funds through the Alabama Department of Finance

Planning for Grant Management, Monitoring, and Reporting

This month, meetings of the board of directors, the finance committee, and the ad hoc ARPA committee focused on the grant project. Discussions encompassed the roll-out timing, provisions of the subrecipient agreement, the impact of federal regulations, the applicability of environmental reviews, and internal controls.

Discussions were held with our auditors and our board treasurer. During a meeting with the Alabama Department of Finance, we were encouraged by the option of treating Habitat affiliates as the "contractors of record" in order to meet the "obligation" milestone.

Documents related to subgrant awards were created, including a three-year planning form that shows the sequencing of construction projects, a monthly report form that parallels the required quarterly report spreadsheets, and a draft memorandum of agreement between Alabama Habitat and local affiliates.

Activities to Support Local Habitat Subrecipients

A mandatory in-person meeting about grant reporting requirements was held with all local Habitat subrecipients on August 9th in Tuscaloosa. The afternoon began with a broad discussion during lunch. Presentations were given on the advocacy effort that led to the \$15 million grant award and on the subrecipient reporting requirements. An animated question-and-answer and brainstorming session identified multiple issues that need further clarification.

An initial discussion was held with two architecture professors from Auburn University about collaborating on program evaluation.

Preparation for Phase One Roll Out of Housing Grants

Six local Habitat affiliates were invited to participate in early pilot testing of the grant program and the draft compliance documents. These affiliates were selected based on strong leadership, readiness to launch grant-funded housing services, and experience with government funding.
